The Internal Family Systems Model

Internal Family Systems (IFS) is a therapeutic model that views every human being as a system of protective and wounded inner parts guided by a core Self. It teaches that the mind is naturally multiple—and that this multiplicity is healthy—because, like members of a family, inner parts can be pushed into extreme roles but also have valuable inherent qualities. IFS helps people access their undamaged, compassionate Self, which knows how to heal, and from that inner leadership, understand and transform their parts, fostering both inner and outer connectedness.

Internal Family Systems: An Emerging Evidence Base, A Strong Foundation for More Research

The IFS Institute is committed to supporting rigorous research to establish the feasibility, acceptability, safety, and efficacy/effectiveness of the IFS therapeutic approach across different clinical presentations. Emerging evidence from small randomized clinical trials and quasi-experimental single-arm studies has highlighted the potential that IFS holds, with positive pilot studies among patients with depression and/or post-traumatic stress disorder. Multiple studies have demonstrated increases in self-compassion. The current body of research remains limited in scope, so well-designed randomized controlled trials (RCTs) with replication for each specific mental health condition are required to establish IFS as an evidence-based intervention for condition-specific mental health treatment indications. To date, reductions in depression are the only mental health condition that has demonstrated statistically significant improvement across multiple pilot RCTs. Larger fully-powered clinical trials are needed for each clinical indication. Finally, though several studies report high levels of acceptability, the risk of harm or adverse events needs to be systematically studied. The studies conducted thus far have provided valuable preliminary insights and represent a strong foundation for future research.

Overview: This Level 2 Intensive Training Program builds on Level 1 training experiences with a focus on children and adolescents. The training features a similar format to Level 1 training that includes didactic, video review, and large/small group experiential and small group practice elements. Like a Level 1 training, equal weight is given to didactic and experiential learning.

Trauma occurring during childhood or adolescence can have a substantial impact on development. Current literature suggests that early exposure to adverse experiences involving child maltreatment in a family setting negatively affect the developing brain in ways that increase risk of problems.

This training:

- Concentrates on the unique challenges of treating children and adolescents who have extreme protective systems and/or have experienced trauma.
- Informs the professional on the use of IFS when applied to therapeutic work with children and adolescents.
- Specifically addresses issues of internal and external polarizations, externalizing techniques, using in-sight and direct access, play therapy and sand tray techniques, and power dynamics in the external system.
- Emphasizes the importance of participation and involvement of parents/guardians/significant others in the lives of the child/adolescent.
- Deepens the participant's awareness of and relationship to their own parts by emphasizing the importance of the therapeutic relationship.
- Emphasizes the importance of the Self in both the child/adolescent and the therapist and includes opportunities for Self-exploration.

Format: The training includes lecture, discussion, demonstration, experiential exercises, and small group practice.

Scope of Practice: Materials and methods included in this course may include interventions or practices that are beyond your scope of practice. As a professional in your given field, you are responsible for reviewing the scope of practice, including activities that are defined by applicable law as beyond the boundaries of your practice, and applying your learning in compliance with your professional standards.

Level 2 Training Certificate of Completion and Attendance Requirements

A Certificate of Completion (non-CE) is awarded by IFS Institute for the completion of the training. Participants must complete 27 of the 32 program hours offered to be eligible to earn this certificate.
