This Affinity Group training is organized for those who identify as neurodivergent. IFSI's formal definition of neurodivergent, as described on the Level 1 General Application, is that neurodivergent means having a mind that functions in ways that diverge significantly from the dominant societal standards of "normal".

The IFS Trainers leading this training would also like to share that:

- There are two basic groups of neurodivergent conditions – innate (present from birth) and acquired after childhood development.
- In this Level 1 the focus is on innate neurodivergence, and some innate neurodivergent conditions include autism spectrum disorder (ASD), attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), learning differences (such as dyslexia, dyscalculia, and others), Tourette's syndrome and other tic disorders, sensory processing differences (such as highly sensitive person, sensory processing disorder), and dyspraxia.
- Neurodivergence represents difference, not deficit or disorder, and neurological differences are part of normal human variation rather than a pathology requiring "fixing" or "curing."
- Neurodivergent individuals may require different approaches to learning.
- A neurodivergent-affirming environment recognizes that communication styles, sensory experiences, emotional regulation, and social interaction may present differently.
- Our intention is to adapt our training environment and techniques to support neurodivergent participants with understanding and respect for different neurological experiences.

This Level 1 Training has the same Learning Objectives, number of training and CE hours, and daily schedule as other Level 1s, and introduces the foundational principles and practices of IFS, equipping participants with the skills to apply IFS in clinical settings.

While we will examine IFS Level 1 content through a neurodiversity lens, this training is not specifically about applying IFS to neurodiverse systems.

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The Internal Family Systems Model

Internal Family Systems (IFS) is a therapeutic model that views every human being as a system of protective and wounded inner parts guided by a core Self. It teaches that the mind is naturally multiple—and that this multiplicity is healthy—because, like members of a family, inner parts can be pushed into extreme roles but also have valuable inherent qualities. IFS helps people access their undamaged, compassionate Self, which knows how to heal, and from that inner leadership, understand and transform their parts, fostering both inner and outer connectedness.

Internal Family Systems: An Emerging Evidence Base, A Strong Foundation for More Research

The IFS Institute is committed to supporting rigorous research to establish the feasibility, acceptability, safety, and efficacy/effectiveness of the IFS therapeutic approach across different clinical presentations. Emerging evidence from small randomized clinical trials and quasi-experimental single-arm studies has highlighted the potential that IFS holds, with positive pilot studies among patients with depression and/or post-traumatic stress disorder. Multiple studies have demonstrated increases in self-compassion. The current body of research remains limited in scope, so well-designed randomized controlled trials (RCTs) with replication for each specific mental health condition are required to establish IFS as an evidence-based intervention for condition-specific mental health treatment indications. To date, reductions in depression are the only mental health condition that has demonstrated statistically significant improvement across multiple pilot RCTs. Larger fully-powered clinical trials are needed for each clinical indication. Finally, though several studies report high levels of acceptability, the risk of harm or adverse events needs to be systematically studied. The studies conducted thus far have provided valuable preliminary insights and represent a strong foundation for future research.

Overview: The Level 1 Training Program is a comprehensive, professional, continuing education training in which participants can develop an understanding of the conceptual basis of IFS and learn how to apply IFS techniques to various clinical populations.

Level 1 Training Certificate of Completion and Attendance Requirements

A Certificate of Completion (non-CE) is awarded by IFS Institute for the completion of the training. Participants must complete 76 of the 91 program hours offered to be eligible to earn this certificate.

- **There will be opportunity** for movement/body-centered processing.
- **We will offer self-selected breakout groups** for processing.
- **Content presentation and pacing** may be adjusted to include multiple learning styles.
- **Self-advocacy and co-creating an inclusive learning space:** participants and trainers are invited to co-create a neurodiverse-affirming learning space, where different learning needs can be named, honored, and included. While trainers may be able to meet some of those learning needs, participants are expected to advocate for and meet some of their own needs.
- **Trainers will use ethernet** connections to optimize audio and video quality.
